

Welcome to the 13th edition of the Sports Legacy Fund Annual Report to the community. It is published in conjunction with the Fund's 14th allocation of grants. The original \$7.5 million fund resulted from the sale of the Kamloops Blazers Hockey Club franchise in 2007 and a contribution with the dissolution of the Blazers Foundation in 2008.

The Society has operated independently from the Kamloops Blazers Hockey Club since the sale but has dedicated the Sports Legacy Fund to the history of the community support for the franchise since its inaugural season in 1984.

The first grants were disbursed in 2009. With the completion of the fiscal year, the Fund distributions to the Kamloops and region sport community will reach an accumulated total of \$4.5 million. During this interval, 125 organizations have received grants.

These continue to be challenging years for the local sport community faced with COVID-19 pandemic restrictions.

The Fund is positioned to help the organizations weather the storm.

The Annual Report represents the evaluation and confirmation that the grants have been appropriately directed, contributing to the sustainability of the recipient organizations, or meeting the expectations outlined in the application process. It recognizes that the Sports Legacy Fund is a community resource and the reporting commits to the transparency of the allocation process.

Grant applications are accepted from October 1st to November 30th of each year and reviewed to evaluate the eligibility of the requests, following which an allocation process is used to determine the direction of funding for the following year. Follow up Community Impact Reports are submitted by the recipients in the December following the receipt of the funds and form the source of information for the Report.

The 2022 allocation of \$343,183 is directed to 33 sport organizations. A number of the grants are leveraged or are matched, providing for the completion of capital projects, equipment and uniform purchases or coaching support.

A summary of the grant history from 2009 to 2022 is documented within the Report.

The Sports Legacy Fund is unique to Kamloops and the region and is envisioned to operate to perpetuity by way of a diverse managed

investment portfolio.

There are three funding streams including board initiatives, the application process and capital projects reserve fund.

The 2022 grants include funding for the Kamloops KidSport Chapter of \$30,000 and PacificSport Interior BC for \$80,000, which have been multi-year commitments as board initiatives and are not part of the application process.

Support for TRU athletic scholarships were maintained at \$25,000, \$15,000 of which will be matched by the university, resulting in a total contribution of \$40,000.

This year, 29 organizations were selected from the applicants to receive grants totaling \$208,983. This ranges from \$600 for the Kamloops Therapeutic Riding Association to \$17,250 funding for the Thompson River Interior Paddling Society to purchase two voyageur canoes and significantly expand its program.

The Capital Project Reserve Fund was not accessed for the 2022 grants. The funding stream is reserved for more major and substantial projects.

The 2022 allocations are listed within the report and include grants for capital projects, equipment purchases, uniforms, and coaching development. A number are contributions to larger undertakings and include facility upgrades for a Kamloops Beach Volleyball Club contribution of \$10,000 for the construction of the

sources of funding and are examples of the

request of the applicants. Representative of these grants is funding of \$15,000 for the Kamloops Long Blades to purchase timing equipment, \$5,561 for the Kamloops Outdoor Skating Association for work on the outdoor skating oval at Inks Lake, and \$10,000 for PLAYKamloops to support its program.

Coaching development remains a key to organizational capacities and is supported by grants of \$9,000 to Adaptive Sports at Sun Peaks and \$5,000 each to Kamloops Minor Hockey Association and Kamloops Youth Soccer Association.

These grants will complement additional leveraging potentials. Equipment is the most predominant

The 2021 grants were provided to 27 Kamloops and Region sport organizations for a total allocation of \$285,456. Annually measuring the impacts of the funding and revisiting the groups receiving them is a vital component of the governance and

oversight of the Sports Legacy Fund.

The funds are strategically aligned with the recipient organization's goals to utilize the grants to strengthen capacity and maximize the benefit, whether purchasing equipment and uniforms, completing a capital project, or developing coaching skills. The funding is leveraged whenever possible to maximize the returns. As was the case in 2020, the 2021 grants were not fully accessed due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and the inability of the recipient organizations to complete the terms of the grant or deliver the allocated program.

The review provides a process to evaluate the grants and determine if the funds continue to be well invested and meet the expectations envisioned by the Sports Legacy Fund vision, mission, and guiding principles. The community impacts are reflections by the organizations based on the funding impacts for 2021. The report is a summary compiled from these impact responses.

ADAPTIVE SPORTS AT SUN PEAKS (ASSP)

ASSP is a volunteer based non-profit society. Established in 2008, it acquired registered charitable status in 2013. ASSP provides winter athletic and recreational programs to support the physical, mental, and emotional well-being of persons with disabilities. The 2021 Legacy Fund grant of \$5,000 was a continuation of support for the instructor certification program.

The goals of Adaptive Sports at Sun Peaks are:

- To provide opportunities for people of all ages living with a disability to participate in adaptive snow sports and recreation programs at Sun Peaks Resort;
- To provide training and continued development of volunteer instructors to deliver these programs and facilitate a positive and safe experience for participants;
- The acquisition, loan, and supervision of adaptive equipment for use by participants as well as maintenance and storage of such equipment;
- Coordinate fundraising and grant applications necessary to sustain the operation and growth of the program.

Volunteer recruitment and retention is a critical component to the success of the Adaptive Sports at Sun Peaks programming. A key element for recruitment and retention of the volunteer instructor along with the high quality of instruction/guiding provided is the commitment to training ASSP offers all instructors

Programming relies on a 100-hour dedication and is supported by Sun Peaks Resort LLP contributing an in-kind donation of 30 season passes.

The society is actively working on developing summertime recreation programming consisting of adaptive biking and water sports at MacGillivray Lake.

BARRIERE RECREATION SOCIETY

The Society received a \$10,000 grant as a contribution to upgrading the curling rink. The facility provides an important sporting facility for the North Thompson Valley. The rink has been used extensively this past spring, summer and fall for youth baseball and basketball training, and the fall

4H Agricultural Exposition. During the last week of August, TRU hosted a basketball camp. The upgrades are a real asset for the building and the community.

FIRST NATIONS SNOWBOARD TEAM SUN PEAKS

The \$8,000.00 grant was used for snowboard gear. The team bought five new racer snowboards and bindings, geared more for free ride and freestyle. The boards were purchased for the expert High-Performance riders, as they have been part of the team since they were beginners and have advanced with consistent practice each season. With the purchase of top end snowboards, the impact on the riders has given them the opportunity to practice extreme turns, jumps, pop and get air. When a trick has been successfully completed or tried, builds the confidence in the rider. With the pandemic, the team has not been able to compete in competitions, but have participated in local events, where a few of the team members placed in their categories.

If the pandemic levels out, there is a plan to send the High-Performance team to the competitions within BC. One of the most important impacts the riders have for their future, is becoming a competitor in the winter X games, or becoming a coach for the team. Most recently, a team member completed the Comp Introduction Coaching Course. Whichever path the rider decides to take in their future, it is for certain, that snowboarding will be one of their lifelong favorite sports.

KAMLOOPS AQUATICS CLUB

The Kamloops Aquatics Club (KAC), the non-profit society that underlies Kamloops Classic Swimming (KCS) used the 2021 **GRANT IMPACTS 2021**

grant of \$6,852 towards the purchase of equipment to host swim meets and help swimming at the Canada Games Aquatic Center

Unfortunately, due to COVID-19 all swim meets after March 16th, 2020 were cancelled. Virtual meets were held in 2021.

The purchase of this additional equipment will significantly improve the quality of performances at the Kamloops events and help the club secure the hosting of the 2023 Swim BC Summer Interior Divisional Swimming Championships. During the first three months of the 2020-21 swim season, the Kamloops Classic Swim Team operated out of three different facilities until the Canada Games Pool (CGP) was fully renovated.




KAMLOOPS BALL HOCKEY ASSOCIATION

Despite losing the 2020 season to the pandemic, the association was fortunate to put on a short season in 2021, introducing many new youth and adult participants to the sport. The grant of \$1,936 resulted in six sets of youth hockey jerseys ready for the 2022 season. The Fund has allowed them to acquire much of the needed equipment to jump-start youth hockey programs and spur the growth of the sport.

KAMLOOPS CANOE AND KAYAK CLUB

KSLF awarded Kamloops Canoe and Kayak Club (KCKC) a \$13,000 grant towards the purchase of two used twenty-fivefoot Clipper voyageur canoes and a new



carbon/kevlar 4-person high-kneel canoe (aka: C-4). The two voyageur canoes were an invaluable addition to both the Spring School Field Trip and the Summer Day Camp programs in 2021.

With these two boats on the water at Shumway Lake, up to eighteen youth participants with beginner paddling experience could be directly supervised and instructed with one camp leader in each boat, as opposed to having participants in solo pelican-type kayaks and the leaders in motorboats.

This was a benefit on windy days (of which there are many at Shumway), which results in beginner paddlers being unable to control solo kayaks. It also allowed camp participants to gain experience in paddling as a team and maneuvering a large canoe.

Acquisition of the new C-4 in 2022, the manufacture of it delayed due to the pandemic, will provide a major benefit to the competitive team. It will level the playing field in races against other clubs that currently have similar boats.

KCKC's existing C-4 canoe weighs 80 kg, is over 30 years old, is made of wood, and needs major structural repairs. The new C-4 will have a much stiffer carbon/Kevlar construction and will weigh about half of what the old C-4 weighs (40 kg). The men's and women's 4-person canoe and kayak events have always been the most important races at regattas for team building and club pride.

KAMLOOPS COLLEGIATE BASEBALL SOCIETY

The grant of \$5,335 was used for the purchase of a pitching machine for the Thompson Rivers University Wolfpack Men's Baseball Team. The past season

was challenging, and the benefit of the machine allowed the hitters to work on the fundamentals needed to better prepare for competition.

They utilized the equipment to its fullest and feel strongly that the benefits will be felt far beyond this year, but also for many seasons to come, allowing the team to be more competitive in the Canadian Collegiate Baseball Conference.

KAMLOOPS GYMNASTICS TRAMPOLINE CENTRE

KGTC is a member-based, not-for-profit gymnastics facility that inspires enthusiasm for and lifelong improvement in gymnastics and trampoline by providing positive and diverse programming. With an exemplary record of service to the athletic community since 1979, KGTC is a proud recipient of the Ed Brougham Club of the Year Award by Gymnastics Canada. KGTC has a well equipped 15,000 square foot facility and is part of the multi-sport Tournament Capital Centre that neighbors Thompson River University (TRU).

The grant of \$40,000 was a contribution to the foam pit upgrade to a BigAirBag pit, which is manufactured in Holland and will be installed in early 2022. The centre currently has a 571 square foot loose foam pit, used daily since 2006, that is now obsolete due to COVID-19.

Gymnastics BC has prohibited use of loose foam pits as they are unable to clean every individual block. The pit is a highly used area for all the programs, and it is a crucial training tool to safely learn new skills. The athletes are going to be able to try and perform new skills without the worry of 'bottoming out' hitting the bottom of the loose foam pit.

The airbag system comes with a removable antiviral top sheet. The antiviral and antibacterial protection (HeiQ Viroblock NPJ03 technology) has been tested in their laboratory and is effective against the COVID-19 causing virus.

KAMLOOPS INTERIOR DRAGON BOAT SOCIETY

KIDS is a small recreational club targeting people over the age of 55 who are interested in dragon boating and socializing with other seniors. A pop-up canopy was purchased with the \$2,822 grant.

The canopy is a 10 x 20 commercial grade, which will be used by the club at dragon boat festivals. Unfortunately, due to COVID, KIDS were still not able to dragon boat in 2021. However, the canopy will ensure that they have a visual presence at dragon boat festivals across the province. Each year, the club attends 4 to 5 festivals, including the BC 55+ games, which in 2022 will be held in Victoria, BC.

KAMLOOPS MINOR HOCKEY ASSOCIATION

The \$5,000 grant awarded to Kamloops Minor Hockey Association has been used for the reimbursement of fees associated with the various courses and certifications that are required for the volunteer bench staff and team officials.

It has been a very successful program retaining a great number of volunteers as they spend significant amounts of time contributing their knowledge, skills, and love of the game to the young hockey players.

Having a grant like this helps the future coaches and bench staff with opportunities to support the association.

KAMLOOPS MINOR LACROSSE ASSOCIATION

The grant of \$7,842 was used to purchase two sets of Category 2 lacrosse goalie gear, six folding field lacrosse nets, and eight field lacrosse goalie sticks.

The newly outfitted goalies were able to experience a season of training and instruction while having safe and properly fitted goalie gear for their experience. With the return to an almost normal field lacrosse season, Kamloops Minor Lacrosse was able to use the six folding field nets to aid with training for all their age groups.

They purchased two small lacrosse nets, two medium strength nets for the middle age groups and two heavier duty nets for the oldest teams. These folding nets are extremely easy for coaches to transport and set-up. The smallest nets aided in building confidence with the brand-new players who are learning the game for the first time and experiencing the position of goaltender.

Regulation size nets are often daunting

for the youngsters, and the smaller nets were a welcome sight for this group.

Being able to put new field lacrosse goalie sticks into the hands of the goalies was a welcoming addition for the association.

Failing goalie sticks have a grave affect on the efficiency at which a goalie can perform their role. The new sticks brought confidence and pride to our Kamloops Minor Lacrosse goaltenders, and this showed throughout the season and into playoffs

KAMLOOPS SPORTS COUNCIL

The \$13,445 grant provided the Kamloops Sports Council the opportunity to purchase the Perfectmind registration system and the YKANow website.

The impact that the registration has had on the local sports organizations has been significant and will only increase in the future. Currently, they are providing registration assistance to The Kamloops Youth Soccer Association, Kamloops Volleyball Association, Kamloops Ball



Hockey, TRU WolfPack, Boogie the Bridge, Kamloops Minor Lacrosse, Sportball Kamloops, Kamloops Rugby Club, Sunrays Synchro, and the McArthur Island Curling Club

This list will continue to grow as the YKANow brand becomes more well known through the marketing campaign.

This initiative is one of a kind in Canada and will continue to help grow the local sport organizations in Kamloops for years to come.

KAMLOOPS SUNRAYS SYNCHRONIZED SWIM CLUB

A small grant of \$270 was well used by the Sunrays for training equipment, including stretch bands and figure bottles. The projected outcome for 2020-21 was:

- To equip athletes to be able to train flexibility at home during COVID-19.
- To equip each athlete with a set of figure bottle as they are not able to share equipment.
- To create and support a meaningful season for athletes during virtual meets.

KAMLOOPS THERAPEUTIC RIDING ASSOCIATION

Thanks to the 2021 Kamloops Sports Legacy Fund grant of \$1,753, the KTRA was able to help three of the para-dressage athletes on their journey to qualifying for the 2022 BC Summer Games.

The athletes competed in the Equestrian Canada Para-Dressage Video Competition Series. The series allows athletes to experience competition conditions in the comfort of their home stable and on a familiar horse.

To participate, riders simply have their performance recorded and submit the video to EC's online ParaDressage Video

Competition Series Portal. This was the very first time any of these riders had ever competed in an equestrian competition.



KAMLOOPS TRACK AND FIELD CLUB

The Kamloops Track and Field Club received a grant of \$5,896 to purchase equipment for the youth programs.

Despite the pandemic, the junior development level (9–13-year-olds) doubled membership and now has a waiting list for that program. Similarly, the track rascals program membership for 3–5-year-olds and 6-8-year-olds increased, and the club hired more coaches. The equipment consisted of new pole vault poles, indoor shot puts, indoor turbo javelins and discus, which are all weight appropriate.

The impact the funding has made with the purchase of equipment has been substantial. The coaches have enough

equipment to run programs properly with no waiting time.

The other piece of equipment that was significant was the pole-vault/high jump measuring stick so that competitions can run faster and smoother, decreasing the change for errors and the time factor. The impact on new hammers and hammer handles means an athlete does not have to bear the cost of purchasing their own when sometimes it's a hardship for families. Since the inception of the Fund in 2009, the KTFC has received grants totalling \$135,609.

KAMLOOPS TSUNAMI SUMMER SWIM CLUB

The grant of \$4,240 provided the club the opportunity to purchase two new

shelters/pop up tents, 150 team logo silicone swim caps to represent Tsunami, 2 split interval timing stopwatches for the coaches and 70 team logo t-shirts. This essential equipment enables the swimmers to remain competitive within the Okanagan Region in many meets throughout the season, as well as within the province at the British Columbia Summer Swimming Association (BCSSA) Provincial Championships.

The COVID-19 restrictions continue to be a challenge for the team. They have a growing challenge in maintaining members and receiving adequate pool time, but with the help of the City of Kamloops aquatics staff, the BCSSA provincial governing body, the BCSSA Okanagan Region, the club executive has worked tirelessly to ensure that they have policies and procedures in place so that the team can continue to train and be ready once competitions come back in to play.

KAMLOOPS WATERSKI CLUB

The grant of \$2,252 was a contribution to the purchase of an automatic jump measurement and display system for youth development waterski jumping.

This system automatically senses a jump, calculates the distance, and displays and records the distance. The addition of this system to KWSC's infrastructure ensured that the club has the top waterski jumping facility in BC.

The highlight of its successful application was the KWSC Grasslands Open tournament as well as two weeks of youth high performance regional camps.

Another highlight of the use and application of the system was enabling youth club members to train with it

regularly. The impact was clearly shown by the phenomenal results KWSC's youth athletes achieved in multiple jump events in 2021

KAMLOOPS YOUTH SOCCER ASSOCIATION

Throughout the 2021 KYSA soccer season, there were many changes and modifications to programming due to ongoing COVID restrictions. While they were not able to roll out the season exactly as planned, they were fortunate to be able to keep players active and coaches engaged with modified programming. The coaches play a significant role in the ability to offer programs, and they saw a positive number of coaches return amongst the uncertainty.

The Sports Legacy Fund grant of \$5,000 allowed the association to expand the capacity of their mentorship program to work with most of their coaches throughout the season. In a year filled with uncertainty,

providing guidance and support to the volunteer and paid coaches was invaluable. They were able to continue developing coaches to help them be successful and return to KYSA for the next

KIDSPORT KAMLOOPS CHAPTER

KidSport Kamloops is a chapter of the national not-for-profit organization that provides financial assistance within School District 73 for sport registration fees and equipment to kids aged eighteen and under. The local chapter is a resolute volunteer committee, which solely relies on donations to aid financially disadvantaged

The 2021 grant of \$15,000 supports this work and the community is also encouraged to step up and help. More information about the operation of the chapter as well as a source for donations is available at www.kidsport.ca/kamloops.



PACIFICSPORT INTERIOR BC

PacificSport Interior BC is a Regional Sport Centre that educates, inspires, and engages communities in the sport pathway. The not-for-profit Society is connected to a network of five PacificSport Centres and three National campuses (Canadian Sport Institute) and the Regional Alliance across the province.

PacificSport Interior BC aims to increase awareness, opportunity and participation in physical activity and sport – from playground to podium – while enhancing access to coaching and athlete programs. The Interior Regional Sport Centre has developed a variety of programs and services to support Interior-based sport initiatives at all stages of the Canadian Sport for Life continuum. PacificSport works collaboratively with the municipal, education, health, and sport sectors to provide sport development opportunities and program for the local sport community. Together, they strive to provide purposeful

program delivery that empowers our communities to play, participate and perform through sport.

The 2021 grant of \$80,000 is matched funding directed to coaching development and ancillary support. due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

All the funds for coaching grants are fully leveraged by either the local or provincial sport organizations or the athletes themselves. They are not only funding upper-level development and performance but provide the participating organizations with much needed grass roots support that significantly enhances their abilities.

The coaching development component grant contribution of \$65,000 is directed to (see table below)

The sharpener was also used for emergency sharpening for other teams or user groups that they could proudly assist. The practice jerseys allowed the team to look like a professional team proudly displaying the Thompson Blazers and the Legacy Fund logo.





